Professor Adapa Satyanarayana is formerly a Professor of History at Osmania University. He received D.Phil. Degree in South Asian History from Heidelberg University, Germany. His area of specialization includes the socio-economic history of modern India, with a focus on Subaltern history. Prof. Satyanarayana also served as Diaspora Chair Professor at Goa University, 2012-13; Visiting (DAAD) Professor, Jacobs University Bremen, Germany, 2009-2011; Visiting Professor, India Studies Chair, Martin-Luther University, Halle, Germany, 2007 - 2008; Visiting Fellow, Centre for Southeast Asian Studies, Kyoto University, Japan, 2006; Fritz-Thyssen Visiting Fellowship, Francke Foundation, and Martin-Luther University, Halle, Germany, 2002; Visiting Fellowship, International Institute of Social History, Amsterdam, The Netherlands, 1999-2000; Visiting Fellowship, Centre for Modern Oriental Studies, Berlin, Germany, 1998; The German Academic Exchange Fellowship (DAAD) South Asian Institute, Heidelberg University, Germany, December 1996-February; The Japan Foundation Fellowship, Institute of Oriental Culture, University of Tokyo, Japan, 1995–1996; Junior Fellow, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, India. 1991–1992.

Prof. Satyanarayana has widely written and published several articles and books. Some of his works include: *Economy, Society, and Polity: Studies in Agrarian History* (2022), Orient BlackSwan; *Dalits and Upper castes: Essays in Social History* (2005), Kanishka Publishers; *Andhra Peasants under British Rule, 1900-1940* (1990).

Prof. Satyanarayana received State Award for Best Meritorious Teachers 2009 by the Government of Andhra Pradesh, India. He was also a Nominated Member of the Indian Council of Historical Research, from 2008 to 2014, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. He worked as Academic Advisor to the Telangana Public Service Commission, 2016-2019.
